



Hornady Match Bullets

Reasons to shoot Hornady Match Bullets

- 1) Hornady match bullets are made with the best jackets in the industry.
 - a. Jacket concentricity (wall thickness variation) is held to under 0.0004" of an inch.
- 2) Bullet to bullet, lot to lot consistency. Our match bullets under go stringent measurements to ensure they remain consistent day in day out.
 - a. i.e – base to ogive, diameter, overall length, and weight are just to mention a few.
- 3) Testing – Once the bullets meet are strict tolerances, they test fired at 200 yards instead of 100. This extra distance really helps us confirm that the bullet is “top of the line”.
 - a. i.e – we regularly shoot 5 shot groups that measure ½ - ¾ of an inch at 200 yards. That’s 1/4 – 3/8 MOA!

In 2009 Hornady match bullets set some new 1000 yard club records.

- Iowa 1000 yard club heavy gun score record – perfect 100 - 4X (5.822”) ten shot group at 1000 yards.
 - Hornady 6.5mm 140 gr. Amax
- Midwest 1000 yard club in MO heavy gun score record – Perfect 100 – 4X (5.819”) ten shot group at 1000 yards.
 - Hornady 30 caliber match bullets
- Minnesota 1000 yard club light gun group record – 2.559” five shot group at 1000 yards.
 - Hornady 7mm caliber 162 gr. Amax

Hornady match bullets also won the 2009 Minnesota 1000 yard benchrest state championship and the 2009 Missouri 1000 yard benchrest state championship held at the Midwest Benchrest club.
